

Better Gas Safe than sorry. Gas safety guide for tenants.





## Dangerous gas work can be deadly. By law, gas engineers must be on the Gas Safe Register.

Gas Safe Register is the official list of gas engineers who are qualified to work safely and legally on gas appliances. It has replaced CORGI registration. Only use a Gas Safe registered engineer to fit, fix or service your appliances.

All registered engineers can be found on our website or by calling 0800 408 5500.

Landlords have legal duties under the gas safety law. It's important, as a tenant, to know what they have to do.

Your landlord must keep all gas appliances supplied for you to use in good condition. They must arrange for a Gas Safe registered engineer to carry out a gas safety check on them every 12 months.

**ALWAYS:** 

- Check the ID card of any gas engineer that comes to do work in your home.
- Cooperate with your landlord and let a registered engineer in when a gas safety check or servicing has to be done.
- Ask for a copy of the gas safety record before you move in or within 28 days of it being carried out.

## Remember to check both sides of the ID card for:

- the licence number
- · the start and expiry date
- · the security hologram
- the work the engineer is qualified to do
- · up-to-date qualifications

Badly fitted and poorly serviced appliances can cause gas leaks, fires, explosions and carbon monoxide poisoning. If you think a gas appliance is faulty, turn it off and let your landlord know immediately. If you feel unwell, seek medical help right away and call the gas emergency helpline.





Gas engineers must be Gas Safe registered in the United Kingdom, Isle of Man and Guernsey.
